Dr Rita Padawangi

"To Overlook | To Look Over"

Rita Padawangi is Associate Professor of Sociology at Centre for University Core, Singapore University of Social Sciences. With academic trainings in sociology, urban design and architecture, Rita's research interests span across the sociology of architecture, social movements and participatory urban development. She coordinates the Southeast Asia Neighbourhoods Network (SEANNET), a collaborative project on urban life in cities that connect academic institutions, scholars and communities for research and education. Rita's recent works focus on the humanistic aspects of city-making, particularly place-making in city neighborhoods, through collaborative approaches in research, teaching, and community engagement. Her recent research projects include themes of vernacular heritage, urban disasters, and urban aspirations.

Professor AbdouMaliq Simone

"Inoperable Relations: Urban Life at the Extensions"

AbdouMaliq Simone is a Senior Professorial Fellow at the Urban Institute, University of Sheffield. He works on issues of spatial composition in extended urban regions, the production of everyday life for urban majorities in the Global South, infrastructural imaginaries, collective affect, global blackness, and histories of the present for Muslim working classes. He is also a research associate at the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Religious and Ethnic Diversity, visiting professor at the African Centre for Cities, University of Cape Town, research associate with the Rujak Center for Urban Studies in Jakarta, and research fellow at the University of Tarumanagara. For three decades he has worked with practices of social interchange, technical arrangements, local economy, and the constitution of power relations that affect how heterogeneous African and Southeast Asian cities are lived. He has worked on remaking municipal systems, training local government personnel, designing collaborative partnerships among technicians, residents, artists, and politicians.

Professor Hyun Bang Shin

"Theorising from/about Overlooked Cities: Area Studies and Urban Studies Approaches"

Hyun Bang Shin is Professor of Geography and Urban Studies at the London School of Economics and Political Science and former Director of the Saw Swee Hock Southeast Asia Centre. He is currently Head of Department in the Department of Geography and Environment. His research centres on the critical analysis of the political economy of urbanisation, politics of displacement, gentrification, housing, the right to the city, urban spectacles, and speculative urbanism with particular attention to cities in Asian countries such as China, South Korea, Malaysia, Vietnam and Singapore. His most recent projects on circulating urbanism and Asian capital involve field research in Quito, Manila, Iskandar Malaysia, Kuwait City and London.
